Caring for Children CACHE Level 1

This qualification is designed to stimulate interest and encourage the learners' understanding of the skills and knowledge needed to care for young children. It builds on the knowledge covered in Entry Level Caring for Children.

It is aimed at learners needing to develop life skills as well as those who are thinking of working in childcare.

Sector Overview

The Childcare Industry is forecast to grow over the next five years in line with rising employment, which is set to stimulate demand for childcare services.

Additionally, as more households become eligible for free childcare and tax-free childcare schemes, government expenditure within the childcare sector is expected to increase.

Entry Requirements

The entry requirements for this course are:

- Maths and English Assessment
- Assessment and interview

If required, you will study GCSE or Functional Skills English and/or maths alongside your course so you can progress to the next level.
